Northgate Remembers

On Friday 8th November the Northgate community gathered to pay tribute to the brave men and women who served and sacrificed for our country. It was a moment of reflection and respect as everyone observed a minute's silence, with the sound of The Last Post played by Mr Brook echoing through the air in remembrance of the fallen.

During the ceremony, our Deputy Head Boy, Wyn, and Deputy Head Girl, Maisie, read the moving poem For the Fallen, a timeless reminder of the courage and sacrifice of those who fought for our freedom. Following this, our Head Girl, Kyra, and Head Boy, Henry, shared the poignant words of In Flanders Fields, honouring the memory of soldiers lost in battle.

Representatives from each year group, joined by our Heads of School and Mr Hambling, CEO of the Trust, placed crosses and silhouettes in a powerful tribute to the fallen heroes. This collective act of remembrance was a reminder of the enduring legacy of their sacrifice.

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone who participated in and observed this meaningful moment of reflection. A special thank you goes to Mr MacDonald for his careful organisation of the service, ensuring that we were all able to come together in such a respectful and dignified way.

Students have gained over 33,000 merits since September - a fantastic achievement. Over the Christmas holidays many students will see their merit totals rise with the awarding of attendance and no negative bonus merits. A big thank you to Mrs Lyons, Miss Peach, Miss Morrison and the Well-Being Team for organising this year's Anti-bullying week. The theme for this year was 'Choose Respect'. There was a whole host of videos and discussion points made available for PART lesson on the theme of 'choose respect', looking at what respect means, why respect is important and whether it is possible to disagree and argue respectfully with someone. The team also hosted a 'Tea and Natter' session one lunchtime, providing a safe space for students to come and chat and have their voices heard. Northgate High School Governors

Northgate High School Academy Stakeholder Committee (ASC) is made up of parents, teachers and community governors. We wish to recruit two new parent governors and one community governor. A community governor would be from the local community and is not a parent of a child at the school therefore bringing a wider perspective to our discussions.



Traditionally Northgate governors had a statutory role and had decision making responsibilities including finance, health and safety, staffing and the curriculum but as members of Unity Education Trust this oversight is undertaken elsewhere and the main focus of the ASC is "to support the Trust Board and the school in developing and maintaining effective links within the school's communities and ensuring the school meets its responsibilities to its stakeholders".

We meet once a term, after school with members of the school community to review and discuss agenda items directly impacting the role of the ASC such as surveys of pupils, parents and staff. We learn how the views of stakeholders are taken into account by the school and how the school communicates with its stakeholders i.e. the frequency and content of the school's communications with parents. Our next meeting is scheduled for February 2025.

If you would be interested in becoming a governor/member of the Academy Stakeholder Committee, nominations are currently under way for two new parent governors and we are seeking expressions of interest in the post of community governor. with even more challenging words ahead!


English teachers have been really impressed with the manner in which the Year 7s and 8s took on this challenge - the year groups have been 'a-buzz' with excitement!

A special shout-out to Miss Woodier, our fantastic spelling bee pronouncer, who donned an awesome costume!








